works for the City Council for facilitating and negotiating this venue for us.

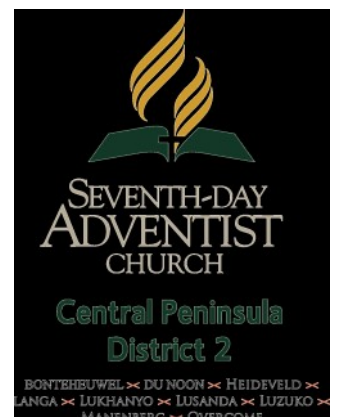

Pastoral Care Strategy

CENTRAL PENINSULA DISTRICT 2 has 9 congregations. These are Bonteheuwel, Du Noon, Heideveld, Langa, Lukhanyo, Lusanda, Luzuko, Manenberg and Overcome, in alphabetical order. Luzuko and Overcome are branches that were initiated by Lukhanyo in Franschoek. Their membership statistics indicate that they will soon become companies

and soon thereafter organised churches. The number of congregations we have means that the pastor will be available to your church once a quarter, although we will have two opportunities of interaction in a quarter. We therefore will do ministry in the following way; each church will have a week of pastoral involvement in the cycle of nine weeks. The pastor

will be available to your church for a week beginning with Sunday and ending with Sabbath. Sunday will be dedicated for church board meetings which will normally be at 8:00 and if, it is possible the church business meeting will follow 2-3 hours afterwards or as per announcements.

The Monday will be prioritised for visitation of the sick, troubled and

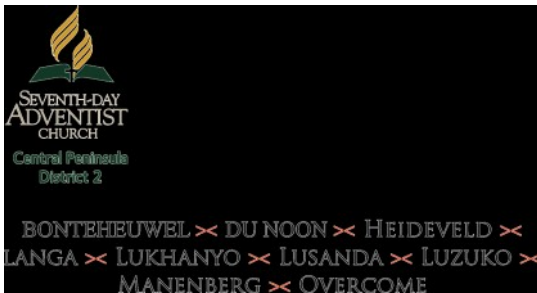

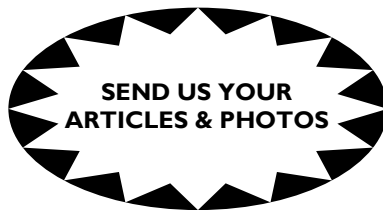
CHURCH PLANTING
